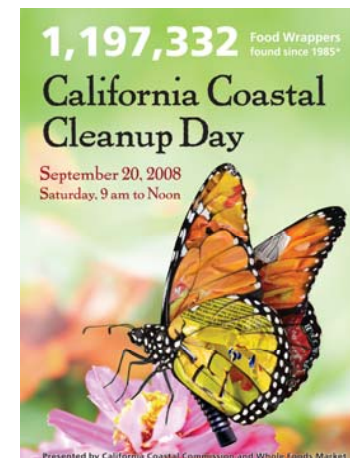
DRAW YOUR FAVORITE OCEAN OR CREEK ANIMAL

- The Recreation Center office must be notified no later than one week prior to the first class that the student wishes a Department Credit. No exceptions! No refunds or credit adjustments will be issued after the class begins.
- Credits are processed Monday – Friday, 8:00am to 5:00pm by calling 558-7300.
- The \$8.00 registration fee and a \$5.00 processing fee will be deducted per activity.
- Department Credits are good for one year and may be applied to any future Department activities. Department Credits take one business day to process and will be mailed to you.
